

My organization, a Lancaster City-based community development effort, is an active participant on the core steering committee of the County's planning process, and is also a strong supporter of the smart growth opportunities the Harrisburg Pike corridor presents.

Not only is this corridor home to significant planned and current investment, it also houses several key functions and activities utilized by County-wide residents. From Long's Park and the Main U.S. Post Office to the Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority's major new facility, Park City Mall and Lancaster General's Women's & Babies Hospital and Health Campus, this corridor serves as a daily stop for a huge number of employees, residents and visitors. Because of its current status and because of the potential growth along this corridor, it is critical that we are assessing new strategies to ensure our infrastructure can accommodate all of the various needs.

The Route 30/Harrisburg Pike interchange is among the key nodes along the corridor that require serious consideration for upgrades that will meet the County's needs for decades.
